# 1 August

John 17:17

#### Sanctified by Truth.

These are the words of Jesus, spoken not to a crowd, but to the Father *for you*. In John 17, known as the High Priestly Prayer, Jesus prays for His disciples and for all who would believe in Him. And in this short but powerful verse, He asks the Father to sanctify us that is, to set us apart, to make us holy through truth.

But not just any truth. God's Word is truth.

In a time when truth feels relative and often distorted by culture or emotion, Jesus draws a clear line: God's Word is the source of real truth. It doesn't shift with opinion. It doesn't change with time. It sanctifies us because it shows us who God is, who we are, and how we are called to live.

To be sanctified by the truth means letting Scripture shape our thoughts, decisions, and desires. It's not just about knowing the Word it's about letting the Word go deep, correcting lies we've believed, and realigning us with God's heart.

## 3 August

### 4 August

Proverbs 30:5

And what does His Word do for us? It becomes a shield our protection. When confusion, fear, or lies come against us, we can hide in His truth. We can stand behind His promises and rest in His faithfulness. To take refuge in Him is to put our full trust in who He is and what He says.

It's a reminder that we don't stand before God on the basis of performance, but on the basis of grace. That assurance helps us walk in integrity, guarding our thoughts, emotions, and actions from the attacks of the enemy.

#### 3 John 1:4

Paul's question is also a challenge:

But the good news is this: you can get back in the race. God doesn't disqualify you for slowing down or stumbling. His Spirit empowers you to keep running with perseverance, fixing your eyes on Jesus the author and perfecter of your faith (Hebrews 12:1–2).

Lord, I want to run the race You've set before me with endurance and truth. Reveal anything that is hindering my obedience to You. Help me stay focused, faithful, and free from distractions. Thank You for Your grace that picks me up when I fall. Amen.



## 30 August

Proverbs 23:23

#### Buy the Truth and Don't Let Go.

Truth is not just information it's a treasure. In this short but powerful verse, we're told to buy the truth and to never sell it. This isn't about money it's about value. God is urging us to pursue His truth as something worth sacrificing for, investing in, and holding onto tightly.

David longs to walk in God's truth, not just know it. There's a difference between having head knowledge and living out what we believe. Walking in truth means allowing God's Word to shape our decisions, guide our steps, and define our identity.

He also asks, Unite my heart to fear Your name. David recognizes that our hearts are often divided pulled in different directions by distractions, sin, or fear. But a united heart is a focused heart one that is centered on revering, honoring, and trusting God above all else.

When we let God teach us His way, we learn more than just rules we discover His character. And in that, we find confidence to follow Him, no matter where He leads.

#### Prayer.

Lord, teach me Your way. Help me to walk in Your truth each day, not swayed by emotion or distraction. Unite my heart make it whole and focused so that I may honor You in all I do. I want to live in reverence and love for Your name. Amen.
