

Our walk should match our talk

In this passage, Jesus gives a powerful and sobering reminder about the true nature of faith. He warns that not everyone who *professes* faith in Him truly *possesses* it. Words alone are not enough — our actions must align with God's will. True discipleship is more than calling Jesus "Lord"; it's living as if He truly is Lord of our lives.

1. True Faith Produces Obedience

Jesus is not rejecting the importance of faith or confession. Instead, He's teaching that real faith shows itself in obedience.

To call Him "Lord" is to acknowledge His authority but to *do* the Father's will is to *submit* to that authority in our daily choices.

2. Empty Words vs. Living Faith

It's possible to have the *appearance* of devotion to attend church, say the right words, even serve in ministry yet lack a heart fully surrendered to God.

Jesus warns against this kind of shallow religion. The danger is not in *what* we say, but in *what we fail to live out*.

Our faith becomes authentic when our lives mirror the heart of Christ when love, humility, forgiveness, and righteousness are not just words we say, but truths we live

3. Doing the Will of the Father

So what does it mean to *do the will of the Father*? It means to live in alignment with His Word to follow His commands, to love others, to walk in humility and repentance.

Our obedience is not about earning salvation — it's about expressing our love for the One who has already saved us.

4. A Call to Authentic Living

This verse is both a warning and an invitation. Jesus is inviting us to authenticity to live a faith that is real, consistent, and active.

When we live what we believe, our lives become a testimony that draws others to Him. Our words have power when they are backed by a life that reflects God's grace and truth.

Where we have spoken faith but not lived it, forgive us and strengthen us to do better.


Fill our hearts with sincerity and courage to follow Your ways, even when the world pulls us in other directions.

Before you speak, pause and ask: Does this represent the heart of Jesus? Speak encouragement, truth, and kindness words that match a faithful heart.

4. Walk in Obedience

Read God's Word daily and choose one verse to live out in action. Obedience isn't about perfection it's about surrender and trust.
