







Dear Friends,

Bible Lesson of the Week



The Power of God's Word



This week's practice helps you move from merely knowing about God to experiencing Him as our loving Father. It invites you to slow down, receive His love, and live each day as His beloved children.

1. Daily Scripture Reflection

Begin each day by reading **Hebrews 4:12** slowly, either aloud or quietly. Reflect on the truth that God's Word is alive and active, able to reach deep into your heart and mind. Ask God to prepare your heart to receive His message.

2. Select a Short Passage

Choose one short passage of Scripture each day. Read it carefully, then pause and meditate. Ask God what He is revealing about His character, His promises, or your own heart.

3. Memorize or Carry a Verse

Write down a verse or phrase from your daily reading. Keep it in your phone, on a note card, or memorize it. When fear, doubt, or distraction arises, speak it quietly or silently in your heart to remind yourself of God's truth.

4. Notice God at Work During the Day

Pay attention to moments when God's Word speaks to you through circumstances, conversations, or personal reflection. Notice any encouragement, conviction, or peace that comes from Scripture.

5. End with Prayer

Close the day with a short prayer, asking God to continue shaping your heart and life through His Word. Trust that His living Word is always active, bringing truth, healing, and growth even when change is gradual.
